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Previous Treatment Plan:

Objectives at 2/83 review were commitment to DCYS and exploration of relative & resources for possible permanent placement. Mother's attorney has successfully st convinced court to allow continuence, 3 times, over DCYS objections, thus child is not adjudicated or committed. Attr. Eyan discussed placement and/or guardianship of Tiffany by Mr. and Mrs. Layden, but they decided they would not take on that responsibility.

Services

Social Study was completed by DCYS.

Worker met with Cindy monthly, no success in developing; a placement plan excess for the mother's expressed wish to take the child back,

DCYS arranged visitation for both parents, separately, in the foster home. Father has visited about weekly. Mother visited two times in air months.

Contact with State's Attorney's office indicated case is on jury list, not scheduled-as yet.

Updated Case Situation:

Court hearings were held 3/21, 7/11, 8/8, each time mother's attorney successfully ergued that the Juvenile Court proceedings might affect the upcoming felony case in Superior Court. We opposed the last two continuances, but it appears Judge Ryan will continue to alley our case to wait until the criminal case is disposed of.

Mother and son Steven are still at Mill Ridge. Steven continues to spend a lot of time with the maternal grandparents. Currently, Cindy is working 4-12, grandperents bebysitting. --

Tiffany continues in fester care with Mrs. Granats. Mother has visited twice in six months. Father visits every week.

Child was voluntarily placed on 2-14-83 from hospital after police found her left alone. Court ordered nother to continue voluntary placement while Juvenile Court case is pending. Child is in licensed family home in Danbury, on bus line, and nother has been repeatedly encouraged to visit.
